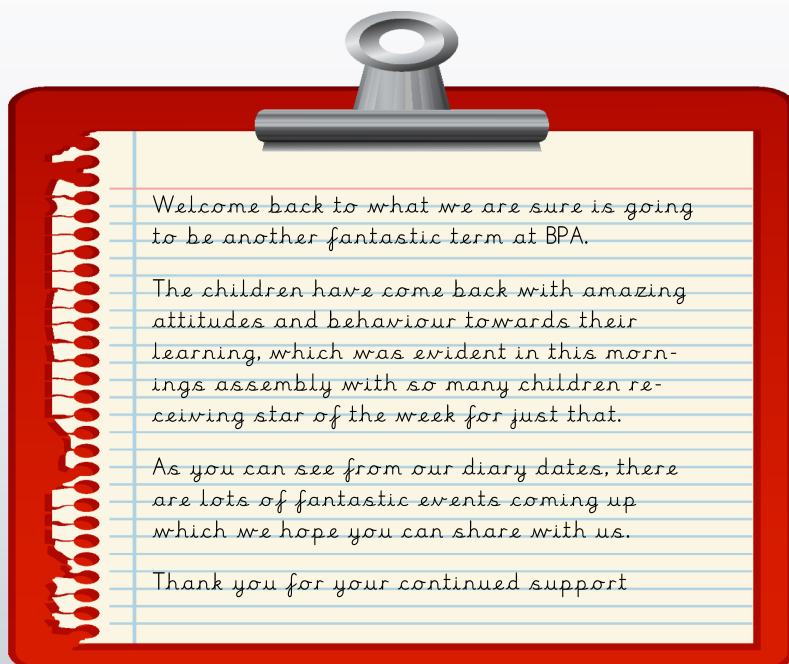

To develop and enhance the SEND provision throughout school to accelerate progress and ensure the RP provision is established and provides first class provision for the most vulnerable learners

To Enhance a clear and successful marketing campaign which attracts, supports and strengthens the community to ensure financial validity and security for the school - including 2 year old provision and RP

To secure, enhance and develop the BPA workforce to ensure consistent and continuity throughout the school to accelerate progress of identified and targeted year groups – Y6 in line with national combined and O progress measure.

To ensure through WAT peer review and WAF - full compliance and self-evaluation is secured and beyond in all areas with particular focus on GDPR and IT.
