

Rationale: On a River will allow children the opportunity to explore the water cycle, geographical locations, states of matter and responding to the world around them.

Subject	Milestone
Science	 Observe that some materials change state when they are heated or cooled, and measure the temperature at which this happens in degrees Celsius (°C), building on their teaching in mathematics. Identify the part played by evaporation and condensation in the water cycle and associate the rate of evaporation with temperature.
Geography	Ask and answer geographical questions about the physical and human characteristics of a location. • Explain own views about locations, giving reasons. • Name and locate counties and cities of the United Kingdom, geographical regions and their identifying human and physical characteristics, including hills, mountains, cities, rivers, key topographical features and land-use patterns; and understand how some of these aspects have changed over time. • physical geography, including: rivers, mountains, volcanoes and earthquakes and the water cycle.
