Dear Parent,

Welcome back to the new school year. I wanted to write at the outset of the year ahead to set out our principles and priorities and to describe some of the recent background work that we have been doing in school and throughout the Trust.

The Wellspring Academy Trust is a charity that manages a community of twenty-nine schools that includes Bramley Park Academy. We are acutely conscious of the challenges that the COVID-19 period has presented for everyone. Throughout it we have aimed to support our schools and, in so doing, the communities they serve. We are entering yet another uncertain phase of the pandemic and will endeavour to do everything possible to maintain continuity and safety. We have benefitted enormously from your support and may continue to require it in the weeks and months to come. School leaders will keep you as fully informed of developments as is absolutely possible. Our aim together is to achieve and maintain learning continuity.

To this end, the Trust has invested some £4.5m in its buildings and grounds this summer. Bramley Park Academy itself has benefitted from investment in new flooring, decorating and painting, flooring works, new maglocks, new doors and new wall partitions. This very substantial investment gives a clear indication to you of our commitment to continually improving the quality of facilities available to your child in school and to keeping our buildings safe, warm, welcoming, water-tight and fit for their purpose.
