IMPORTANCE OF **ATTENDENCE!**



At The Bramley Park Academy we take attendance and punctuality very seriously. We aim to have an attendance figure in excess of the national average of 96.1%. Attendance data is tracked by the Department for Education and will adversely affect our Ofsted rating if it is below the required level.

Our current attendance percentage is 94.9% and we really need to improve on this figure.

We will monitor your child's attendance and if we do not see an improvement we will contact you by letter for a meeting.

Any unauthorised absence negatively impacts on our overall attendance figure as well as your child's attendance and achievement levels. This is why it's really important to tell school each day your child is absent and the reason for absence.

Regular Attendance means Punctual Attendance. Arriving on time for school is just as important. Late arrivals are disruptive for the class and can be embarrassing for the child who is late. Children can also miss important information during registration including the plan for the day.
