## School Attendance

We monitor your child's attendance on a daily basis.

We celebrate your child's wonderful attendance on a weekly basis in a special assembly. Prizes are awarded and a chance to roll the big dice for our game of Classopoly.

100% attendance this term will be celebrated with a certificate and badge.



#### Just a reminder of our attendance policy:

You are required to contact school on the first day of your child's absence and each day they are absent until they return to school. If we do not hear from you, this will be recorded as an unauthorised absence.

If your child's attendance falls below 98% they will be classed as a Persistent Absentee.

You will be invited into school for a meeting and attendance targets will be given.

If no improvement is made then a referral for legal intervention may be required..



The law treats some persistent lateness in the same way as irregular attendance and parents may be prosecuted by the local authority if late arrival is not resolved.

- Poor punctuality can lead to your child...

   feeling embarrassed in front of their friends
  - Missing the beginning of vital lessons
- Missing important instructions for the rest of the school day
- Learning bad habits which could affect their employability in the future

Pupils who are late after the classroom doors closed, must be brought to the school office where parents are required to sign them in on the inventry system and complete a late Arrival Form.


