## **Pupil Premium**

To qualify for Pupil Premium you and/or your partner need to be in receipt of one of the following:

- > Income Support > Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- > Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- > Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- > The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- > Child Tax Credit, provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income less than the amount set out by HM Revenues & Customs (as per their website)

## Attendance is Key to Success Our Philosophy

We recognise that regular school attendance is vital. Children need to attend school regularly if they are to enjoy the educational opportunities provided within the school environment and make consistently good progress and attainment. It is recognised that absence can lead to educational disadvantage for a child and place them at risk of not achieving their full potential.

#### Our school aim:

To improve attendance across the school, ensuring that every class and year group achieves at least 96% attendance and above throughout the year

#### Attendance Information

- A school year has 195 days, 39 weeks, and 3 terms, divided into 6 half termly periods.
- five days in each school year are allocated as training days for teachers
- Pupils are required to attend school for 190 days in each academic year. The school
  day is divided into two sessions: morning and afternoon. Pupils are expected to attend
  school for 380 sessions.
- One day's absence per school year means that a pupil has approximately 99.5% attendance.
- Ten days off per school year means that a pupil has approximately 94.1% attendance.
- Twenty days off per school year means that a pupil has approximately 90% attendance
- 98% attendance means that your child has missed the equivalent of 4 weeks of their learning in school

Please ensure that your child attends school on a regular basis every school day counts!
